Status of the Property

- The property has been home to the Coverdale family for over 100 years.
- Mary Coverdale Winnett Fraser, the last owner, died in April 2022.
- Her friends say that she wanted the Farm to be conserved and protected from development.
- Conversations with the City of Kingston indicate the city is exploring options with Ms. Fraser's estate.
